Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:		
 Real PE (PE programme) was bought for the school. CPD took place at and it received lots of positive feedback. Real PE was being delivered across the school, using the online platform and resources. Teachers reported an increase in pupil engagement. Sports coaches supported/worked alongside teachers with the delivery of PE lessons. OASS entered over 10 various sporting festivals/competitions including gymnastics, athletics and swimming. After school clubs (boxing, gymnastics, multiskills) ran each week for children in KS2. New sports t-shirts were researched and purchased, meaning children next year will look and feel smart and ready to try their very best at festivals and competitions. Playtime leaders were chosen and trained to deliver games during lunchtimes. Consequently, more equipment was being used and a greater percentage of children were participating in physical activity. 2 members of staff trained to teach our children swimming, reducing the cost we pay on hiring swimming coaches.
