## **Literacy: Phonics play**



Go to the Phonics Play website (link in the play button) and explore free phonics games using the username: jan21 and password: home. Try "Grab a giggling grapheme' to practice sounds and letters or "Rocket Rescue" for more tricky segmenting and blending.

These great games help children enjoy developing the skills of phonics. This can also encourage them to become quicker in their recognition of letters and words, which will really help their reading.





## **Maths: stampolines**

Watch the Numberblocks episode: Stampolines. What do you notice about the different shapes? Can you use paints, pens or squares of paper to make your own stampolines? Maybe you can use potatoes or carrots to make vegetable prints?



This activity develops a concept called 'conservation of number', which means that there can be four (or five or ten) blocks even if they look different and are arranged in different ways. This is a great way for children to compare objects and pictures representing numbers.





## Personal, social and emotional development



Children will be returning to school after a long time learning from home. Change can be difficult for everyone, but talking about it helps. Discuss how you and your child feel about this change. What are the good things? What are they worried about? What can you do to get ready?

Change can be tricky for everyone. It's a good idea to talk about and prepare for change, because it gives children time to get used to the idea. Remember the people, the space and the activities of school.
