



WHAT WILL WE LEARN TODAY?

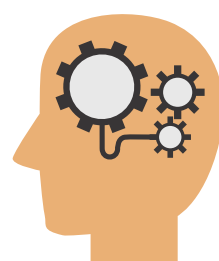
Home learning: Monday 8th February



Literacy: the same as my name

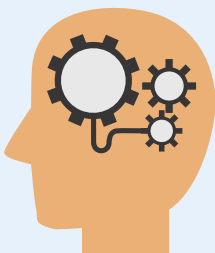
Learning to pay attention to individual sounds in spoken words will help with segmenting which is a skill needed for spelling words.



Maths: numberblocks

Watch the Numberblocks episode 'Numberblocks Castle.' What do the Numberblocks do to solve their problems? Can you replicate what the Numberblocks do with objects in your home?

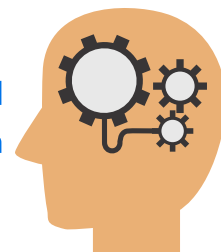
Using manipulatives (things you can move around) help children learn by allowing them to move from concrete experiences to abstract reasoning.



Communication and language

Grab a pencil and some paper. Tell your child what to draw whilst also drawing it yourself without showing them. Use simple instruction like 'draw a big circle, now draw a small circle next to it.' When you are finished compare your drawing, do they look similar? Was it easy or difficult?

'Listen and do' games are great for developing communication skills. Listening is a vital skill that will help in all areas of learning. Listen and do games can also help build confidence in understanding vocabulary and following instructions.
