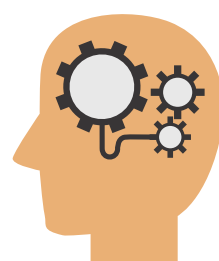


Literacy: Reading time

Reading together is the most important home learning you can do with your child. MyOn makes it easy for you to access a wide range of books online.

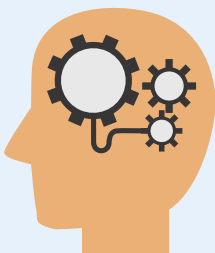


Maths: ordering numerals to 15



Jumble up the number cards and work with your child to put them in order. Help them to think about what they know about the numbers: ask "Which one comes first?" or "I have got 5 here, what number comes after 5? 1, 2, 3, 4, 5..."

The 'stable order principle', which means that we always say the number names in a specific order, is one of the rules of counting that young children must master. This activity also helps children to connect numerals to number names.

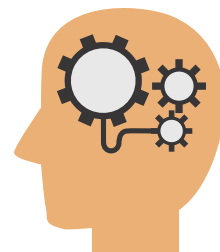



Physical development
