Morning Activity (STEM/Investigations based):	Activity guidance:	What will we need?
<p>Build 3 structures based on The Three Little Pigs.</p> <p>In the story of The three Little Pigs they each made a house and the wolf tried to blow them down. Your task is to create three different houses/structures and see which one is the best.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decide what your structures/houses are going to be made out of. • Collect the materials you need and create your houses/structures. • Decide how you are going to test your structures. The wolf huffed and puffed to blow the houses down. How can you create a 'wind' to test them? • You could use a fan or wave something to create a breeze. How will you make sure the power of the wind is the same? 	<p>Materials to build your houses/structures out of e.g.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lego • Paper • Cardboard • Plastic containers <p>Something to create the 'wind'</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fan • Waving a piece of paper or cushion

<p>Create a mask for a fairy tale character</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decide on a character from a fairy tale. • Choose a material to make your mask out of and make your mask. • Think about how you are going to decorate it. • What can you do to ensure people know what character you have chosen? 	<p>Things to make a mask out of e.g.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cardboard • Paper • Paper plates • Cups • Pipe cleaners • String • Coloured pens/pencils • paints

<p>Record yourself reading your favourite fairy tale</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Choose your favourite fairy tale • Choose a space to read your story • Read your story out loud and get someone to record you doing it. • Think about how you can change the voices of the characters when reading aloud. Think about the punctuation and how it helps your reading. • Remember to send a copy of your reading to us or take some photos of you reading your favourite fairy tale. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Favourite fairy tale – this could be found online or you may have a book that you enjoy reading. • iPad to record yourself.
