	Step 1: Design your 3 different houses. Ensure you label your designs. Make it clear what each house is made of. Choose 3 different materials. Predict which	
	Step 2: Build your 3 houses, using your designs for help. Have you got a figure to sit inside your house?	
	Step 3: Test your houses for sturdiness. Have you got a fan or	
	hair dryer? If not then maybe you can create a fan. Now direct	
	the wind at each house at a time. What happens?	
	Step 4: Evaluate your houses. Did they survive the wind? Can you <u>explain</u> why a house survived/did not survive?	TEARR
