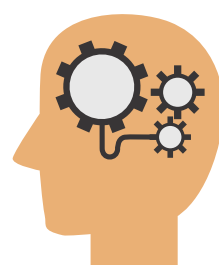

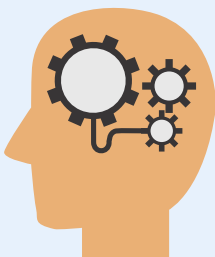
Listening to stories is one of the most important ways that young children learn. It develops their vocabulary, understanding and literacy. Acting stories out is a wonderful way for children to develop storytelling skills.



Personal, social and emotional development: King or Queen for a day

Many fairy tales have kings or queens as important characters and these people make the rules of their kingdom. Imagine you are in charge for a day: what are your rules and why? How are you going to encourage people to stick to them?

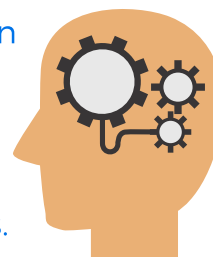
Children are constantly learning about the rules of the world around them. Sometimes these are written down, like school rules, sometimes they are not. This is a good way to explore social rules.



Understanding the world: fairy tales from around the world

Where do fairy tales come from? Can you find out about fairy tales from around the world? Are they the same or different? Many of our traditional tales are shared in Europe, with some interesting differences. Some places have very different traditional tales. Can you find out about stories from other cultures?

Young children begin to understand that things are different in their home than they are in other places. This is the beginning of curiosity and understanding.
