If you are at home or at school, you have probably seen that **learning is different right now**, but are they **will it ever go back to normal**? This is what you will be thinking about today.

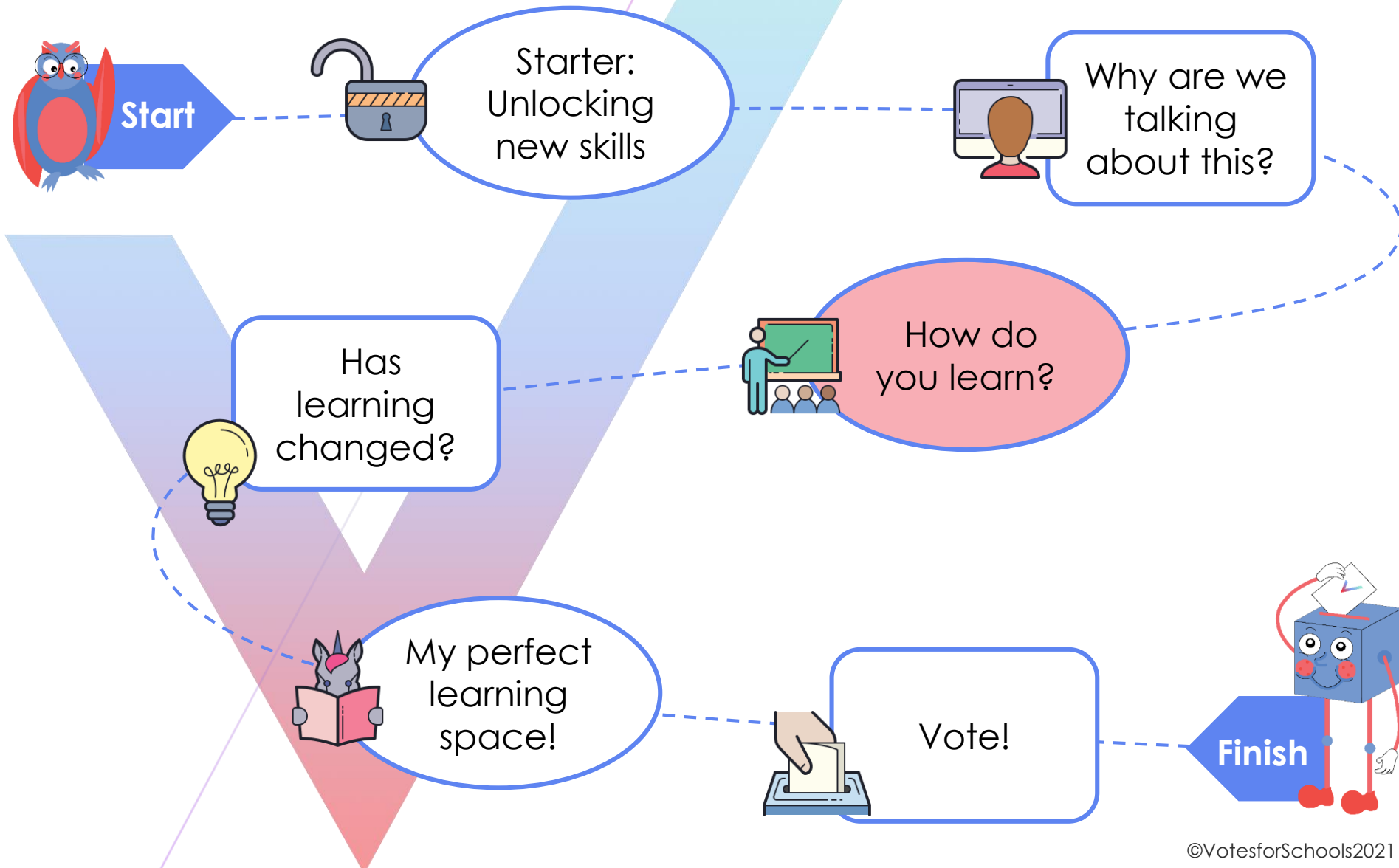

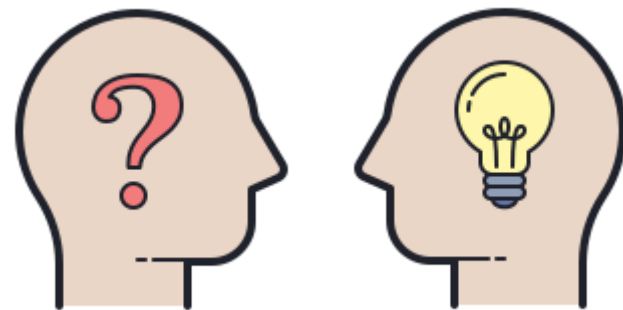




How do you learn?
