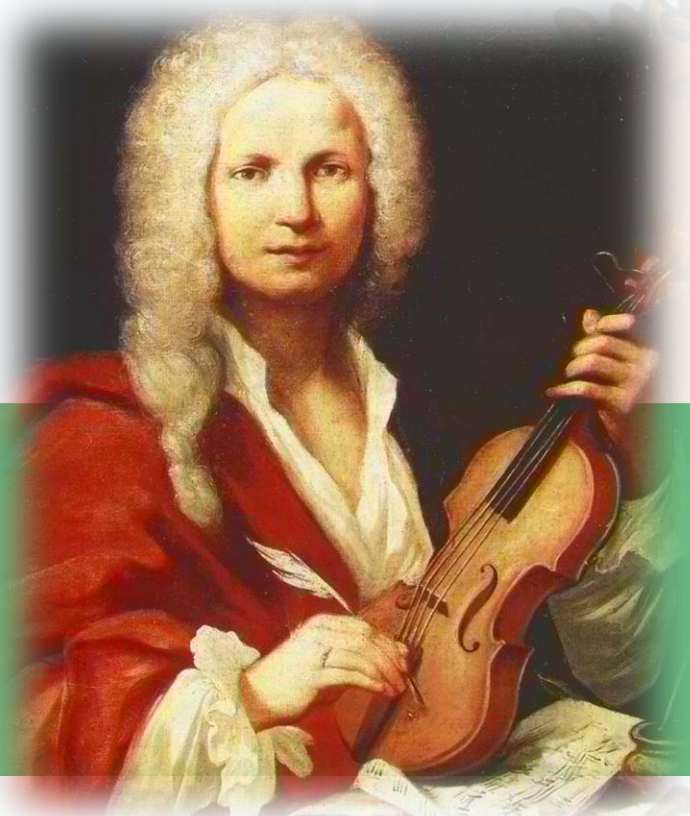
Autumn

Tempo

Be an Artist!

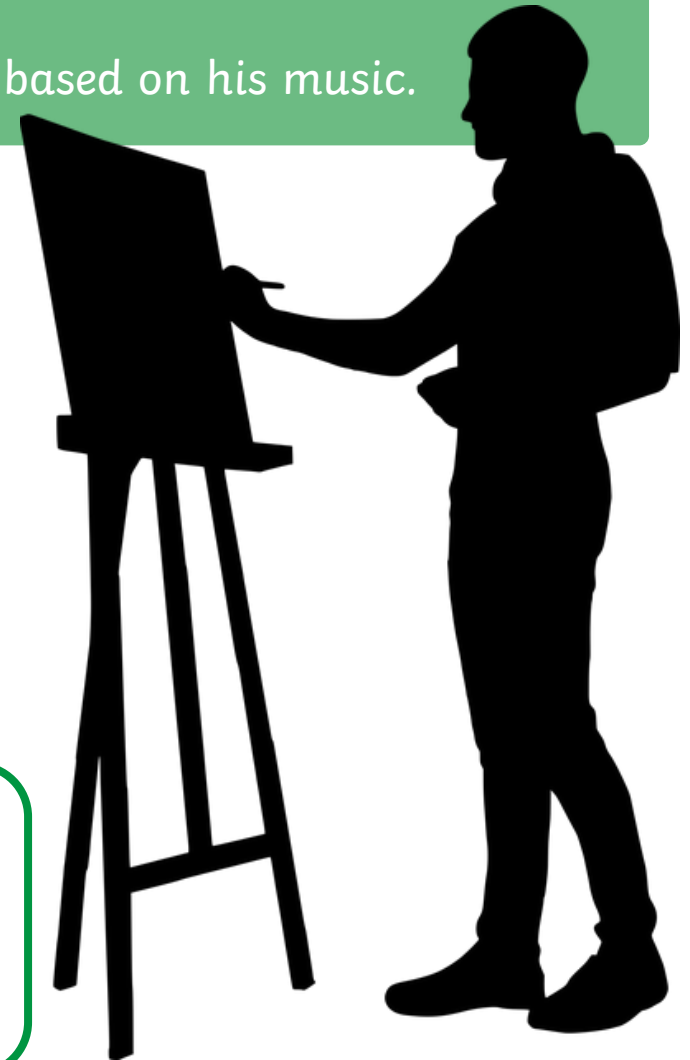


Vivaldi uses music to describe spring.
