What Is Shabbat?

Shabbat is an exciting and important day that Jewish people look forward to all week.

For **Jewish** people, **Saturday** is a special day, just like **Sunday** is special to **Christians** and **Friday** is special to **Muslims**..



Shabbat is the **fourth commandment:** 'You shall remember to keep the Sabbath day Holy.' Saturday was the seventh day of the week and the day that God rested after creating the world. Ever since ancient times, Jewish people have kept the Sabbath day Holy by celebrating Shabbat.

When Is Shabbat?

It happens every weekend, beginning on Friday evening, and ending

Saturday evening.



On Friday, families work together to prepare food, clean their houses and lay their dining tables ready for Shabbat.

How Is Shabbat Celebrated?

When Shabbat begins on Friday evening, everyone puts on their best clothes and gathers for their special meal. Other family members and friends may join them for this special occasion.




There are lots of traditions that take place during a Shabbat meal.

Challah Bread

Challah is a special plaited loaf that is bought fresh on Friday morning, ready for the Shabbat.

Two loaves are always bought together.





Challah tastes much sweeter than normal bread. This helps remind people that **Shabbat is special**.

Other Customs

Families will also visit a **Synagogue** during Shabbat.

are sung.


