Learn it:

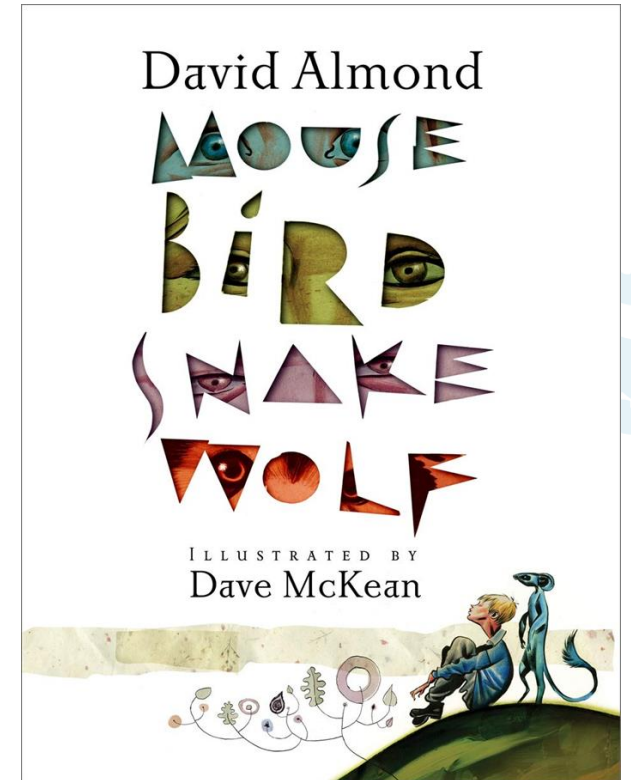
Prediction is using evidence from a text to say what may happen next, what events may unfold or how a character may behave.

Today we will use the front cover to make predictions on our new story. You can follow these steps to make a prediction:

Step 1 - Look at the cover

Step 2 - Pick out something you notice

Step 3 - Use it to explain your prediction on the book.



Example: I see a boy sat on the hill, so I predict there may be a boy as the main character in the story.

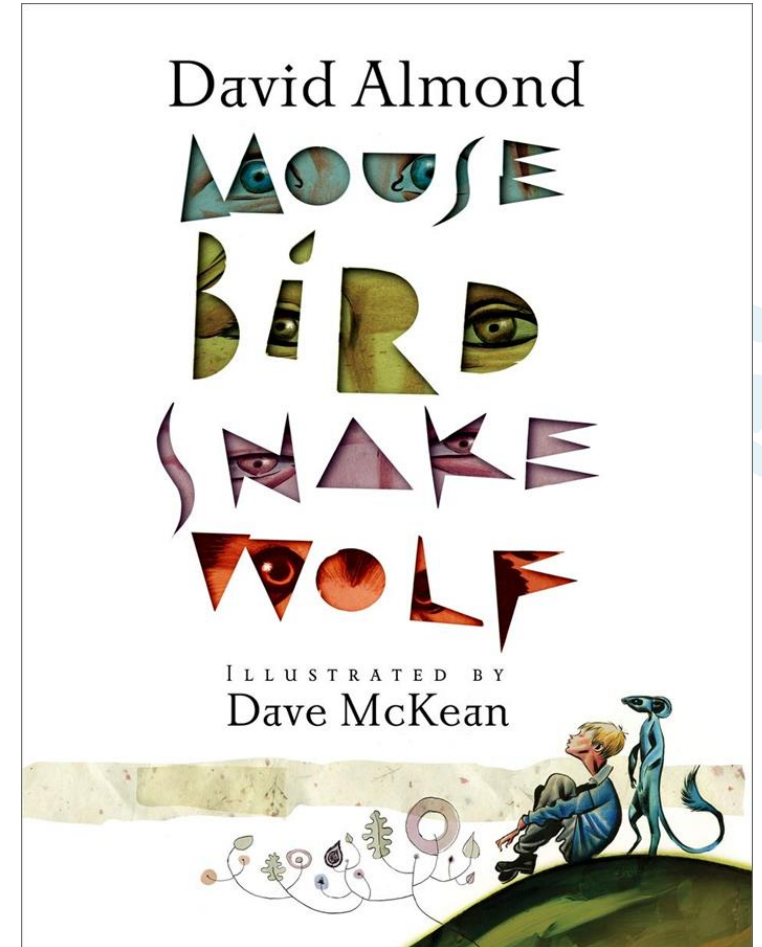

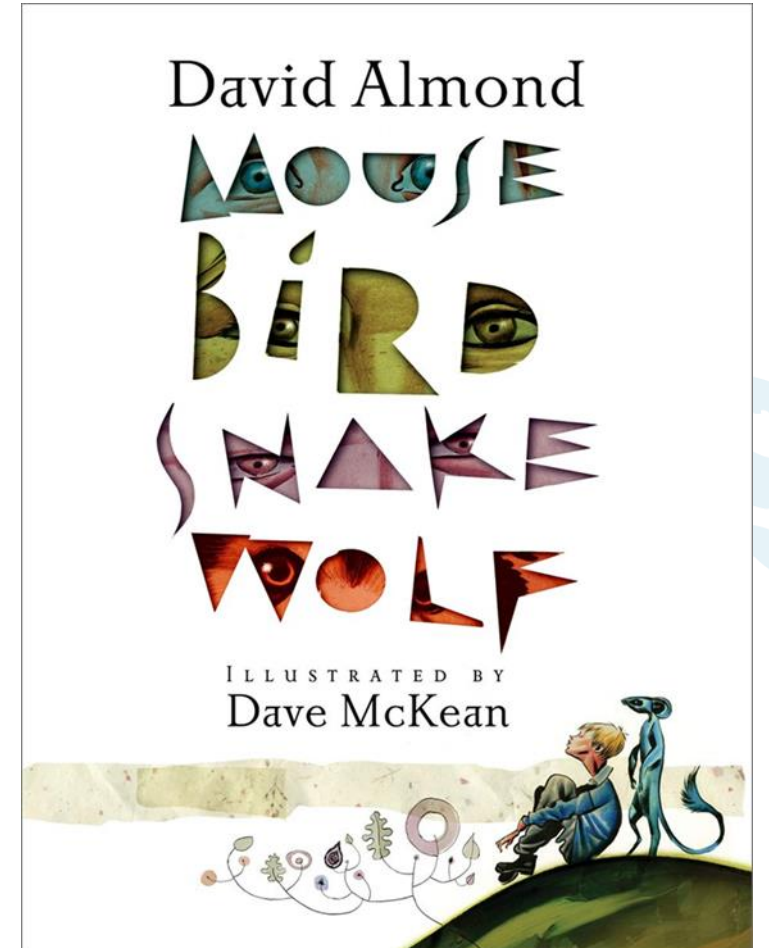
