


Was good news overlooked in 2020?

While Coronavirus may have been the most talked about thing in the news last year, it was not the only thing. That's why, this week, we're asking whether good news was overlooked in 2020!





Carbon dioxide (CO²) emissions were down **7% this year** worldwide – that's **2.4 billion tonnes!** As well as this, the UN has made a low-carbon recovery plan for the world once the pandemic is over, which will hopefully reduce emissions even more...





Boris Johnson also made his own plan to help the environment here in the UK. His plan is designed to tackle climate change and also create or support 250,000 new jobs. The plan will cost billions of pounds, and will use things like wind energy, which we have lots of!

Good news for... diversity?





Kamala Harris became the first female, Black and Asian-American to become Vice President of the United States. This means that, if she became President one day, she would also be the first female President and the second Black President in the history of the USA!

In February last year, **Korean film Parasite** became the first **non-English Language film** to take home an Oscar **for Best Picture**. It also **won three other awards** on the night, and was the **first film from South Korea** to be nominated for **International Feature Film**.

During our first lockdown, Captain Tom Moore raised £32 million for the NHS by walking 100 laps around his garden before his 100th birthday, which inspired many other people to also do their bit to support our NHS. More than £100 million was raised for them last year!





Celebrities also helped bring people together, like Marcus Rashford, who made the Government change its mind about money for free school meals! Lots of companies and restaurants also got involved too, with everyone working together to make sure no one was hungry.

SpaceX launched a rocket that nearly flew into space and back down again... until it exploded! So why is this good news? It is a giant leap in progress for finding a rocket that can go into space, return and be reused – something which has never been achieved before.

Lots of COVID-19 vaccines started appearing at the end of last year, but one from Oxford University & AstraZeneca is going to be sold for just £2.30 per dose to countries with less money, making sure that an extra 3 billion people all around the world are able to be vaccinated.






