### Do now – what is a synonym?

- A) A word that has the same meaning as another word.
- B) A word that has the opposite meaning of another word.



### <u>I do:</u>

- Use 'was' when you're writing about a single person 'I was, he was, she was'.
- Use 'were' for more than one person and for direct address -'We were, they were, you were'.

#### For example:

I <u>was</u> so happy when I won that award. They <u>were</u> so happy when they won their award.



#### Pause Point:

Use 'was' when you're writing about a \_\_\_\_\_\_ - 'I was, he was, she was'. Use 'were' for \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_- 'We were, they were, you were'.



#### Pause Point:

Use 'was' when you're writing about a <u>single person</u> - 'I was, he was, she was'. Use 'were' for <u>more than one person</u> and <u>direct address</u> - 'We were, they were, you were'.
