






Commas after subordinate clauses: commas are used to separate the subordinate clause from the main clause - A subordinate clause is a clause that cannot stand alone as a complete sentence



Learn it - Commas after subordinate clauses

Last week, we talked about several of the reasons for using a comma in a sentence -

- 1. Commas to separate independent clauses when they are joined by any of these seven coordinating conjunctions: and, but, for, or, nor, so, yet.
- 2. Commas after introductory a) clauses, b) phrases, or c) words that come before the main clause.
- 3. A pair of commas in the middle of a sentence to enclose words that are not essential to the meaning of the sentence.










Today, we are focusing on commas AFTER subordinate clauses. Most subordinate clauses start with a subordinate conjunction (ISAWAWABUB)


Why is AFTER written this way? Because you only use a comma when the subordinate clause comes first.

For example -

If I can find my wallet, we can all go for ice cream. We can all go for ice cream if I can find my wallet.










So all you have to remember is -

When a subordinate clause begins a sentence, it has a comma after it. When the main clause begins the sentence, there is no comma to separate it from the dependent clause.







Plenary:

Commas after subordinate clauses - tick or fix:

- · Subordinate clauses ALWAYS needs a comma
- If unsure, just add a comma
- Commas are ONLY used BEFORE subordinate clauses
