What Is an Argumentative Essay?

(The technical part)


The core of an argumentative essay and the core of an everyday argument are more or less the same; there is a difference of opinion about a subject, and the two (or more) sides try to convince the other they are right.

In an argumentative essay, the writer presents both their own position on a topic and the opposing position, with the goal of building an argument that supports their position and beats the opposition. This is done by using evidence.

For example, if you're writing an argumentative essay about whaling and your opinion is that it should be stopped, you can't just say that whalers should stop it because it's not a nice thing to do. You need to explain why whaling is bad and disprove the argument a pro-whaling supporter might make about why whaling is important and should be resumed.






