

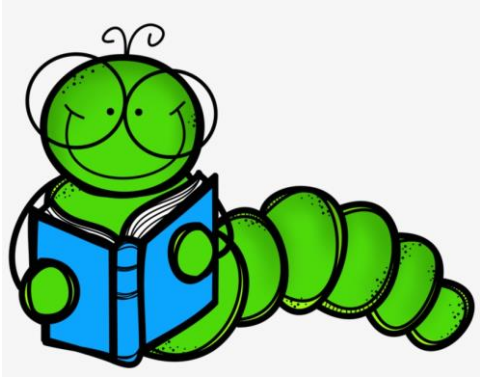

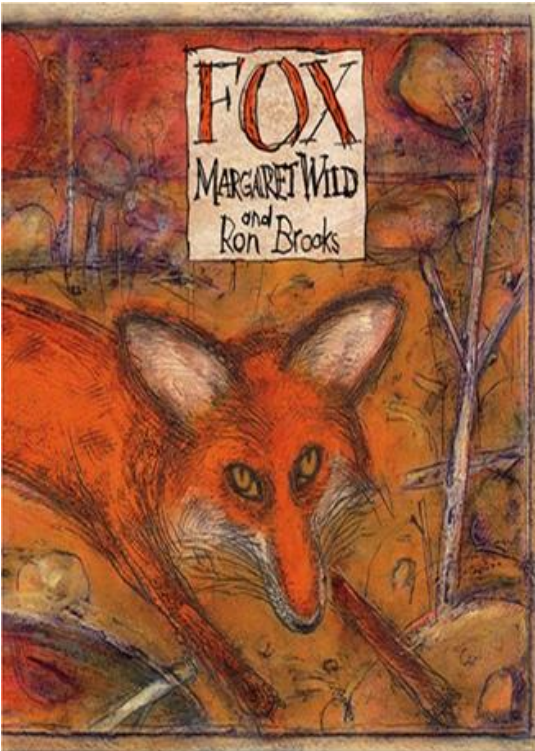

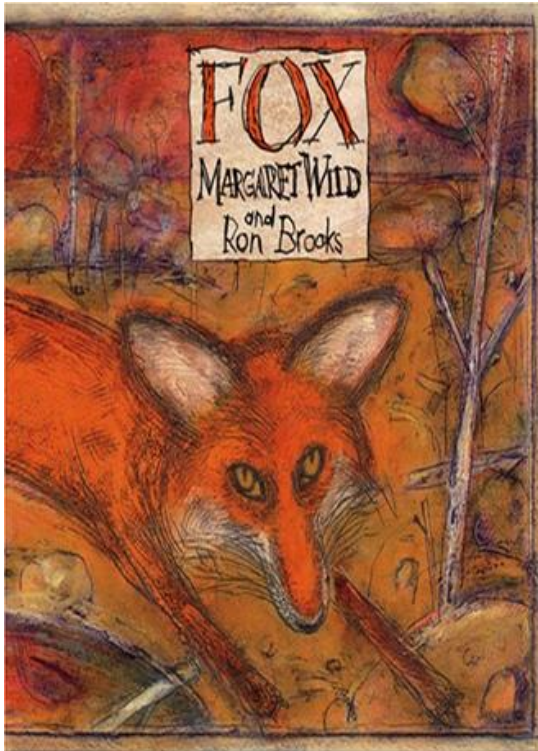
'Good' characters and 'Bad' characters

**Character comparison:** in order to write a successful character comparison, you must look at more than just the descriptions (appearances) of the characters. You need to analyse how they relate to each other (how they get along). You need to examine both characters' roles in the story to understand how they add to the overall meaning of the text.

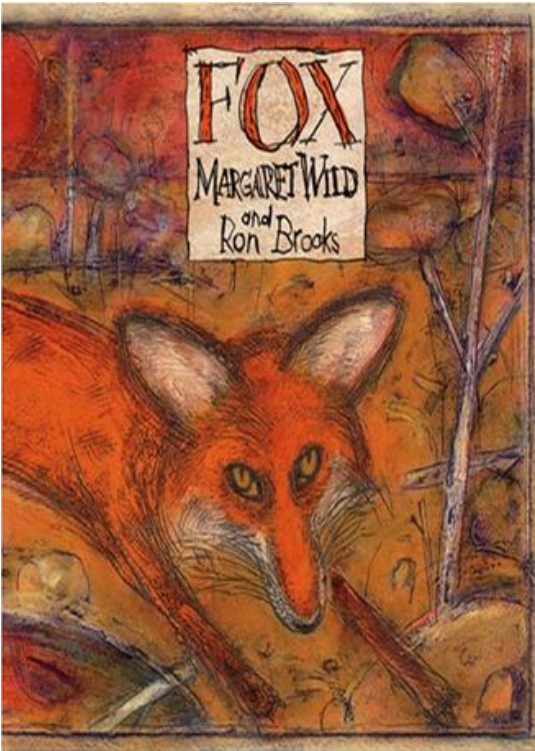

## Learn it - Character comparison



In writing, authors usually have at least two characters that are very different to each other. One is usually 'good' and one is usually 'bad'. Authors do this to create drama and excitement between the two characters.

Plenary:
