



What are persuasive texts?

Persuasive texts are pieces of writing that a created to try and make the reader do something.

Persuasive texts can take several different forms such as advertisements persuading you to buy a new phone, a letter encouraging you to do to something, or a poster encouraging people to stop smoking.


Key features of persuasive texts

One of the key features of persuasive text is imperative verbs.

These are our words which tell the reader what to do. They are also known as bossy verbs.

We put imperative verbs at the beginning of a sentence, which automatically changes them into commands or actions that must be done. They are usually short sentences that are acted upon immediately.


We see them a lot in advertisements or on posters.








