



## **Story Setting**

A story setting is WHEN and WHERE the story takes place.







Settings need to be described in detail so the reader can picture the place clearly in their mind.

The author must consider...

- What is the setting like?
- Is it day-time or night-time?
- What can you see, hear, smell, taste and feel?

#### 'Wow' words

Authors need to use high level vocabulary to make their setting interesting to the reader.

#### **Example**

There was a large tree on the hill.

VS

The enormous tree loomed over the mossy, green floor and gazed down at the creatures below.

Wow words can be advanced adjectives, adverbs and verbs.
