

Yesterday we discussed what a friendship is and what makes a good/bad friend.

Today we are looking at what a test of friendship is and how we may overcome it.

A test of friendship is an event that challenges a friendship

They could end a friendship, strengthen it, or cause short term issues that can be resolved



Jade and Martha decided to go to the cinema together during half term. They agree that since Jade had paid for the tickets, Martha will buy the snacks. However, on the day of the cinema trip Martha doesn't turn up. She leaves Jade standing alone outside of the cinema, having spent all of her pocket money on the tickets. When they go back to school Martha apologises and gives Jade the money for her ticket. She explains that she had gotten sick the day before and lost her phone so couldn't let her know.

Jade forgives Martha and the girls decide to have a Disney film day at Jade's house at the weekend.

Aaron likes basketball, whilst Josh likes skateboarding. They are best friends and always spend their weekends together in the park. One weekend Josh tells Aaron that he can't go to the park because he needs to go and visit his nan. Instead of doing that he goes to the new skatepark that opened by his house, with some other friends from school. Josh begins to do this every weekend, and each time gives Aaron a different reason for not going to the park. After 6 weeks Aaron confronts his friend and starts yelling at him. Josh ignores this and walks away.

What is the test / challenge that they face?

How do they deal with the challenge?

Would you forgive Josh?
