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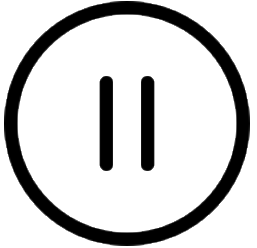
How does the following prefix change the meaning of these root words?

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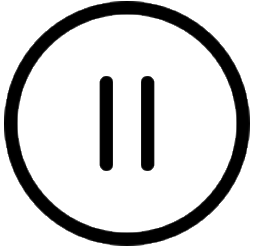
