Introduction: Introduce what you want to say and the purpose of the letter.

Include flattery within the introduction

E.g

I am writing this letter as I genuinely believe that I am the perfect candidate to join your crew. What an honour it would be to join the courageous Ernest Shackleton along your expedition!

1st paragraph: Explain your first reason

Include exaggeration

Eg

I strongly believe that I am best suited in joining you along this once in a lifetime opportunity. I am incredibly strong, as strong as an ox some say, which means I am equipped with helping log heavy goods around the ship. Although others may grow tired and weak along this journey, I can guarantee that I will remain resilient.

Include alliteration and emotive language.
