*The **loud**, annoying **bell above the door***

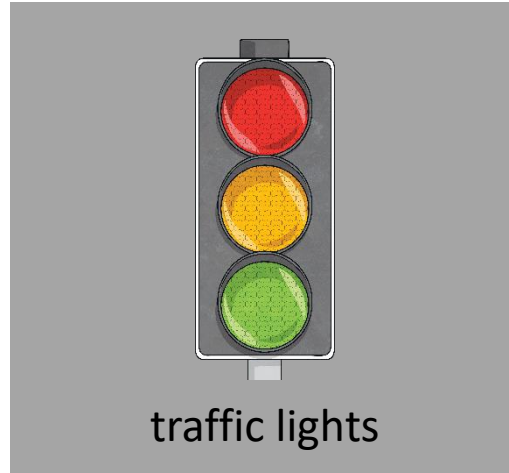

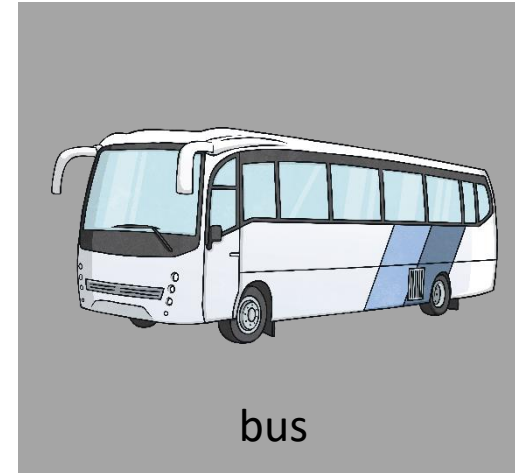
Below are three fantastic additions which could be used to make an expanded noun phrase. Can you use **all** three in one expanded noun phrase which still makes sense?

bus

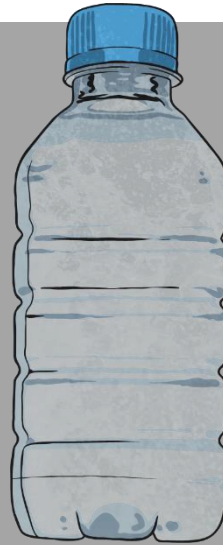

To expand a noun phrase, you can use nouns and adjectives to modify the original noun and add extra detail. List some ideas of how you may be able to expand this noun phrase:

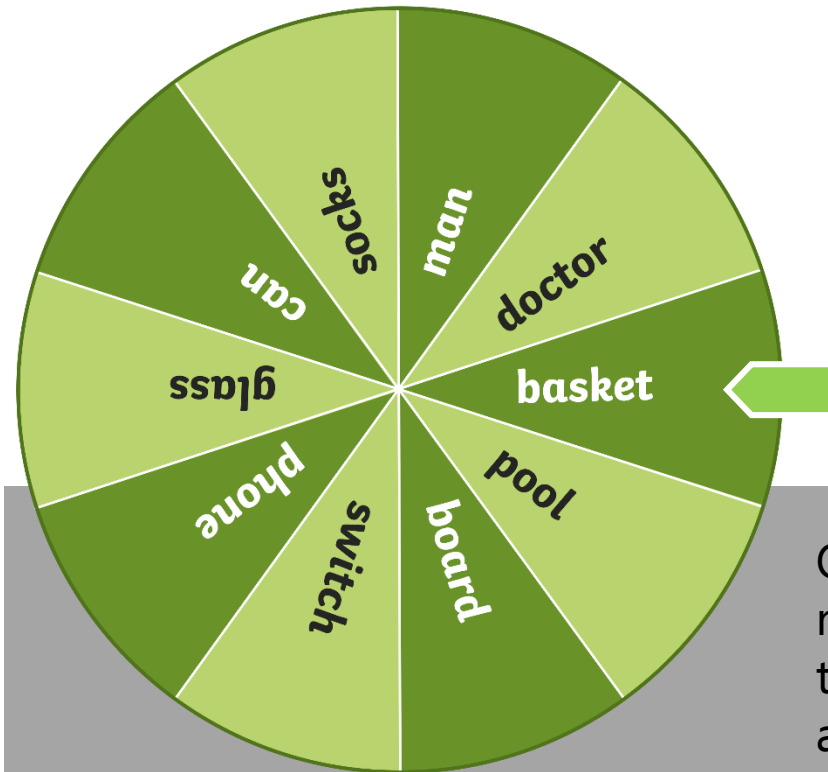

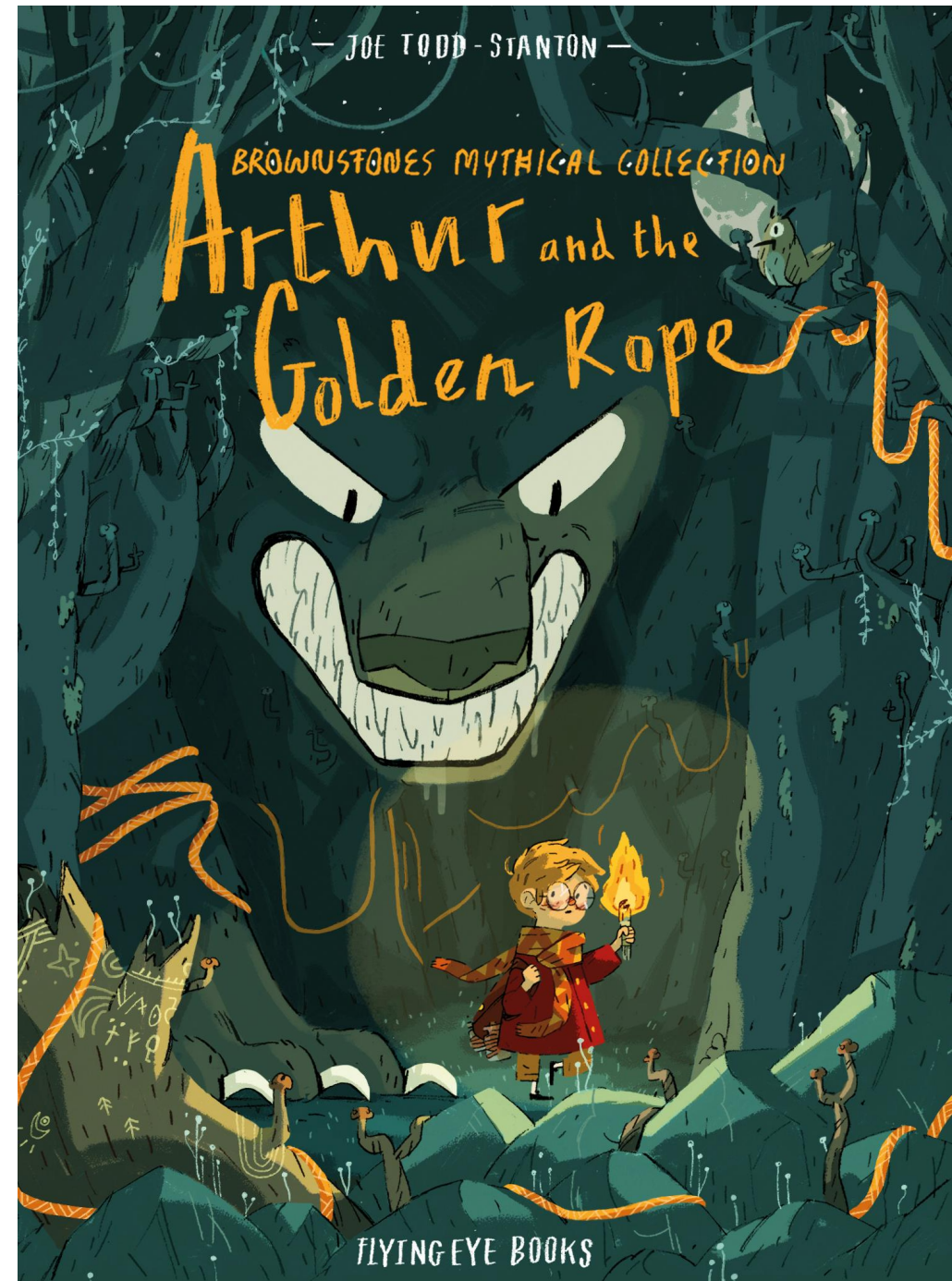


Arthur and the Golden Rope

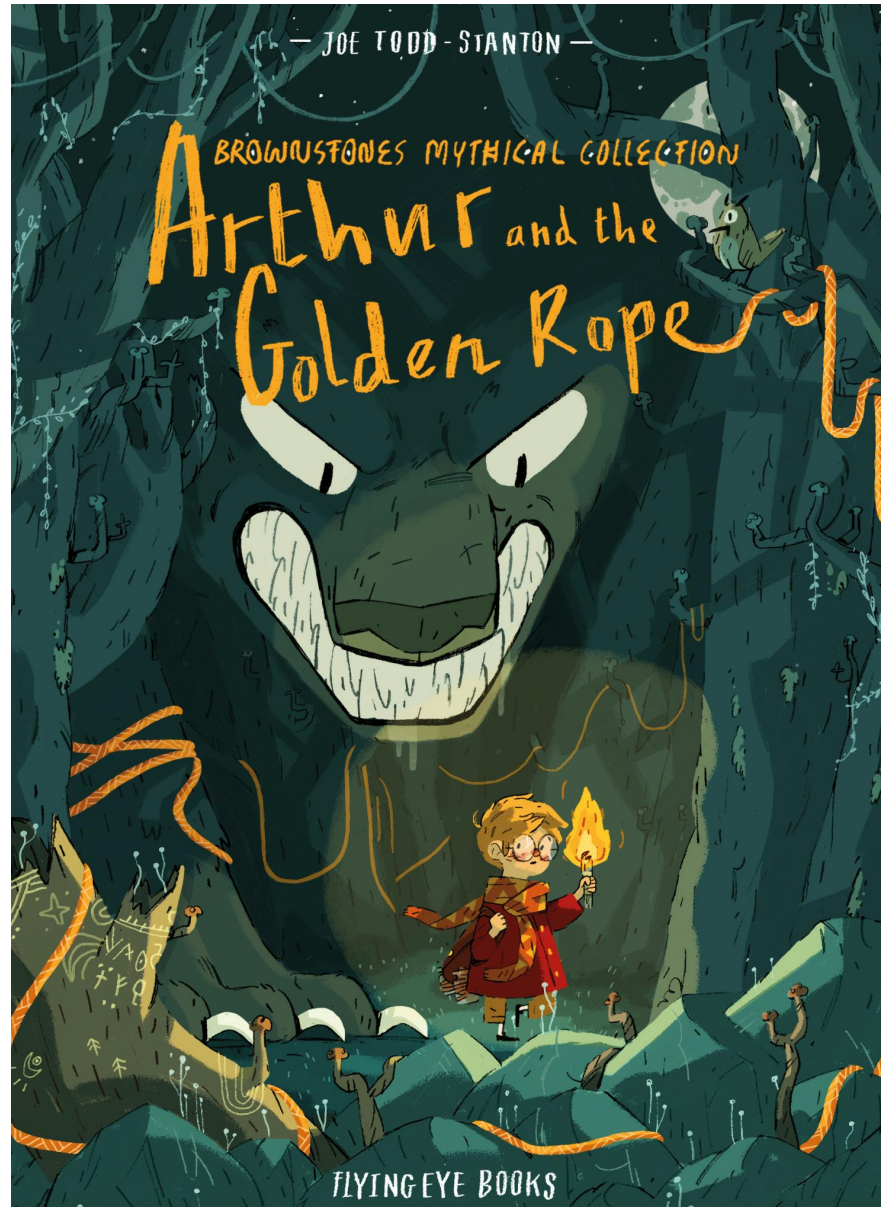
