Today you are going to write a letter to your friend to convince them to come to Iceland with you!

Talk to your partner about the ideas you came up with yesterday! You will need to include these in your letter.

Paragraph 1: What do you want to do?

- Here is Miss Thompson's first paragraph- is there anything you want to add?

Dear Shontelle,

I have heard about this fantastic country! It might even be the best country on earth. When I discovered it I just knew that I had to go on holiday there. You should come with me! I know you may never have heard of this amazing country, its called Iceland. I have been doing lots of research so I can tell you all the reasons that we should definitely visit this incredible country.

You have 10 mins to write your first paragraph- you will need lots of persuasive language to convince your friend.

Paragraph 2: Reasons why we need to go to Iceland

- Here is Miss Thompson's paragraph- is there anything you want to add?

Only a fool would think that Iceland is a country with only ice. Its known as the country of fire and ice! Do you know why? Its because they have lots of volcanos. We have learnt so much about volcanos at school so I cant think of anything more exciting than seeing a volcano in real life. Surely you must agree that would be very exciting. Iceland was discovered by the Vikings and everyone knows that they are so cool. Also there are so many things to see in Iceland such as the aoural lights and the blue lagoon.

You have 10 mins to write your paragraph- try to include 3 reasons and lots of persuasive language

Paragraph 3: Stop their doubts before they begin.

- Here is Miss Thompson's paragraph- do you think this is a good idea...? Or do you have a better one?

Naturally, I understand that you might be unsure. You are probably thinking our parents would never allow us. So I've come up with a sensible idea to solve this problem.
