Term 2 Pupil Progress Meetings



Communication is key to support our pupils in being the best they can be and this term, our Pupil Progress meetings will take place on **Wednesday 15 November**. We welcome the opportunity to discuss the progress your child has made so far this academic year, and how we can work together to enable them to reach their full potential in the coming weeks and months.

Please make sure you have booked an appointment with your child's class teacher using the My Child At School (MCAS) App. Details can be found on the year group newsletters.

Medication

If your child is prescribed medication such as antibiotics for a short period or has a health need that may require medication, please contact Miss Husband as above, to complete the relevant permission to administer medication paperwork. Medication will **not** be accepted by the Admin team.

Our Medical Treatment of Pupils Policy (Primary) which can be found on our school website explains:

Receiving Medication

The parental consent form MUST be completed prior to acceptance of medication onto the Academy site. If two medications are required they must be dealt with as separate issues with the procedures being followed for each. All medication must be in the original container.

All medication must have:

- The pupil's name
- The name and strength of the medication
- The dosage and the times when the medication should be given
- The expiry date

All medication must have written confirmation signed and dated by the parent.

Please DO NOT send your child in with medication or non-prescribed decongestants such as cough sweets / nasal inhalers etc in their bags for the health and safety of all members of the school.



Can I ride my e-scooter to school or work?

No, it's Illegal...

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles and are required to be taxed and insured. It's not possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters, which means it's illegal to use them.

Can I ride my e-scooter on the pavement?

No, it's Illegal...

You cannot use e-scooters on public footpaths, cycle lanes or roads.

What happens if I'm caught using my e-scooter in public spaces?

The scooter may be seized and as a result, destroyed.

If stopped by an officer, you may be asked to complete a breath and drugs test. You also risk a £300 fine and six penalty points on your licence for no insurance.



Think before you buy:

The number of electrical scooters being used on our streets has risen, as well as reports of serious injury and fatalities.

As part of our strong links to local History and the community, did you know the origins of our 4 house names, all of which can be found at Chatham dockyard?

- Ocelot (Yellow) is named after HMS OCELOT, a Cold War Submarine
- Cavalier (Red) is named after HMS CAVALIER, a Second World War Destroyer
- Gannet (Blue) is named after HMS GANNET, a Victorian Sloop.
- Trafalgar (Green) is named after HMS TRAFALGAR, Royal Navy Ship

We use Houses to foster a sense of community and belonging and they are used throughout the year in various ways:

- Weekly house point totals
- Interhouse events such as Sports Day

Pupils can wear a house colour T-shirt (with or without the academy logo) for PE and at interhouse events such as Sports day.

Did you know, tobacco kills an estimated 1.3 million nonsmokers every year who are exposed to second-hand smoke? Are you alright with that being us?

Some of our parents are pregnant and many of our parents have smaller children – we don't want them to be exposed either. We have also noticed that some smokers drop their cigarette butts on the ground – we do not want to be a part of this pollution.

We would appreciate you taking this advice into consideration and stopping smoking or vaping near our school.

Parking Safety

Please ensure that you do NOT park on Dalton Street or under the Deane Court flats. This is a private car park for residents and anyone parking there does run the risk of receiving a ticket or being clamped.

We have had previous incidents where fire engines have needed to attend to a fire in the flats. If this had been at school pick up or drop off time, they would not have been able to access the fire.

The larger gates are our emergency access and **must be always clear**. To safeguard our children, we report all vehicles who are on Dalton Street and blocking our gates to Medway at https://www.medway.gov.uk/xfp/form/155 who will then contact the vehicle owners. We thank you for your support in ensuring our children are safe.
