


He also said that people must **stand 2 metres away from each other.** If some one does not follow this rule, they can be **fined up to £1,000 by the police.**






Whether you're in school or at home, we all find learning difficult sometimes.

Take a look at some of the problems different children across the country are facing in school or at home. What advice can you give them?





It's normal to feel worried and sad at the moment, especially when you can't see your friends or family. It's important that you let somebody know how you **are feeling:** why not call or text someone and talk about it?

This is a tricky situation, but try not to get frustrated! You should tell your teacher about your situation, then try to find ways to keep learning without your computer. You could even work together to get the work done!




